



Privacy Notice for volunteers 06.06.18

Data Protection Act 1998 and General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) 2018: How and why we use Springboard volunteers information:

We process personal data relating to those who volunteer at Springboard. This is to assist in the running of Springboard, to support you in your role, for legal reasons and for monitoring. We must have a legal basis for collecting data from you, and under GDPR there are six lawful bases:

1. Consent: an individual has given clear consent for you to process their personal data for a specific purpose
2. Contract: the processing is necessary for a contract you have with an individual
3. Legal obligation : the processing is necessary for you to comply with the law
4. Vital interests: the processing is necessary to protect someone's life
5. Public interest: the processing is necessary for you to perform a task in the public interest
6. Legitimate interest: the processing is necessary for your legitimate interests

We collect and process your personal data under the following legal bases:

- Legal obligation, legitimate interest and consent.

Where we require consent we will provide a way for you to positively make a decision about the data that you make available and you will be able to change your mind at any time. This will include your involvement in promotion and marketing activities.

What personal data is processed and why is it needed?

- Identifiers such as name, date of birth, photo.
- Contact details (Address, phone number, e mail address, next of kin/emergency contact). You will be asked regularly whether contact details are correct.
- Health information, in order to support you as a volunteer.
- Qualifications and experience, in order to support you as a volunteer and to assist in the running of Springboard.
- Safeguarding children who attend Springboard is of prime importance. We are required to subject all volunteers to an enhanced DBS check and to obtain references. DBS reference numbers are recorded and references kept. Springboard

follow Safer Recruitment principles so all potential volunteers will be asked about any offending history.

- Supervision information will be recorded.

How is your data stored and who accesses it?

All volunteers personal data will be retained according to Springboard's 'Retention, Storage and Security of Documents and Records Procedure', in conjunction with the 'Data Protection Policy'. It will be destroyed six years after you cease volunteering.

Your personal data is stored securely, in paper files and electronically. Volunteer coordinators, managers and those with HR responsibility will have access to these files. Contact details may be accessed by other employees, if necessary.

Your personal data will not be shared with third parties without your consent unless the law allows or requires us to. We are required to share some information with Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).
